Alabama wrapped up its 2009-10 campaign with a 17-15 record under first-year head coach Anthony Grant for the program's 10th consecutive winning season. Alabama finished the season strong with wins in three of its final four games and the lone loss coming to No. 2 Kentucky in the SEC Tournament quarterfinals by a 73-67 margin. The Crimson Tide outrebounded all four final opponents by an average of 11.5 points per game. UA perimeter defense limited those four opponents to 26 percent shooting from three-point range. The defense also held 26 of its 32 opponents below their season scoring average this season allowing opponents to score just 64.8 points per game. The Tide's offense also came around late, averaging 71.5 points in its last seven games after averaging 60.8 points in the previous 11 games against SEC opponents. Of Alabama's 15 losses, five came to opponents that are currently ranked and 11 came to teams currently in either the NCAA or NIT fields. After a three-game spell on the bench, senior Mikhail Torrance responded with three 20-point games in his last seven outings of his career to average 18.5 points per game during that span. JaMychal Green and Tony Mitchell also wrapped up the season strong with each recording a double-double in the final game of the season, the third of the season for Mitchell and sixth for Green. Mitchell averaged nine points and 10 rebounds per game in the SEC Tournament while Green averaged 12 points and nine rebounds.

The Arkansas men's basketball team ended their season at the Southeastern Conference Tournament after a tough loss to the Georgia Bulldogs, 77-64, in the first round. Senior Mike Washington led the way with 20 points and ended his storied Razorback career 29th in scoring, ninth in rebounding and sixth in blocked shots. Freshman Marshawn Powell recorded his 24th double-digit scoring performance of the season in the finale, a total that led the Razorbacks this season. Powell scored 10 points and grabbed a team high six rebounds in the game. Earlier in the week Powell was named to the SEC All-Freshman team by both the SEC Coaches and *Sporting News*. Sophomore Courtney Fortson was named second-team All-SEC after finishing the conference season third in scoring first in assists. Sophomore Rotnei Clarke was named to the SEC Community Service Team and ended the season as just the second Razorback and 15th SEC player to ever hit 100 three-point baskets in a season. He was two shy of Scotty Thurman's school record.

In the Mar. 14 NCAA rankings, Auburn is 13th nationally with 8.5 3-pointers made per game. Senior DeWayne Reed finished tied with Quantez Robertson (2005-09) for Auburn's all-time leading steals leader with 210. Prior to going scoreless on 0-of-5 shooting from 3-point range in Auburn's SEC Tournament loss to Florida, senior Tay Waller had averaged 25.6 points while shooting 31-of-54 (.574) from 3-point range in the last five games, an average of 6.2 made 3-pointers per game. He was the first player since Wesley Person in 1994 to score 20 points or more in five straight SEC games. In the Mar. 14 NCAA rankings, Waller ranked fourth in 3-pointers made per game and 22nd in 3-point percentage. Waller leads the SEC with 3.4 3-pointers made per game, is third shooting 41.0 percent from behind the arc, is ninth shooting 47.4 percent from the field and is ninth in the SEC averaging 15.3 points. Reed ranks sixth in the SEC averaging 16.2 points and is fifth with 4.3 assists. In his final six games, Reed averaged 18.0 points and has gone 34-of-40 from the foul line. Frankie Sullivan finished second in the SEC shooting 85.1 percent from the free throw line, is second in the league averaging 1.9 steals per game and ranks 25th averaging 12.7 points per game. He scored a career-high 27 points to go along with four rebounds, two blocks and two steals in the SEC Tournament vs. Florida. Reed finished with 1,428 career points to rank 11th all-time at Auburn. Auburn attempted 819 3-pointers this year to rank as the second most in school history. Auburn made 271 3-pointers this year to rank as the third most in school history.

Florida wrapped up its season with a thrilling 99-92 2OT loss to BYU in the opening round of the NCAA Tournament. The Gators nearly matched the school record for biggest NCAA Tournament comeback, rallying from 13 down with under 9:00 left to force overtime. The Gators outscored BYU 29-16 over the final 8:35 to push the Cougars to the brink. Kenny Boynton tied the UF NCAA Tournament record with 27 points, hitting five three-pointers. Boynton scored 18 of his 27 in the second half, shooting the Gators back into the game with four three-pointers during the rally. His output tied Udonis Haslem's school record, done in the 2000 National Title game. Chandler Parsons had 20 points and 10 rebounds for his fifth double-double of the year. Vernon Macklin had 16 points and seven boards while Erving Walker had 12 as four of five starters finished in double figures. The Gators knocked down 10 three-pointers, giving them 203 for the season. Florida has hit 200+ three-pointers in every year of Billy Donovan's 14-year tenure, the only SEC school to do so every year in that time. Florida dominated the glass, out-rebounding BYU 45-33, getting 20 offensive rebounds (six from Parsons) leading to 16 second chance points. The Gators hit 55.6 percent from the floor in the second half during their rally, but just 28.0 percent in overtime (7-25). Florida closes its season at 21-13, the 12th consecutive year, one of five schools to win 20+ games each of the last 12 years.

GEORGIA BULLDOGS

Georgia finished the 2010 season with a 14-17 overall record, 5-11 in SEC play. Both numbers are improvements from the previous season, especially so when both schedules are compared. The Bulldogs of 2009 played a schedule whose strength was rated 74th nationally. The most recent Georgia schedule was ranked the 16th most difficult in the country at regular season's end. Indeed, Georgia played 12 games this season against teams that earned spots in the NCAA Tournament; the Bulldogs played another seven games against teams in the NIT. The first Georgia team of head coach Mark Fox made vast strides of improvement offensively. In the 16-game league schedule, Georgia led the SEC in field-goal percentage, 3-point field-goal percentage and assists. For the first time in nine years, its per-game scoring average in SEC play (70.8 ppg) was actually higher than its overall average (68.6). The Bulldogs also excelled in rebounding and free-throw shooting, both of which they ranked second at season's end. Georgia led the SEC in FT accuracy for 10 weeks during the season. Individually, sophomores Trey Thompkins and Travis Leslie formed Georgia's most potent 1-2 scoring combination in seven years. Both were named SEC Player of the Week during the season. Thompkins became Georgia's first unanimous first-team All-SEC pick since Jarvis Hayes did it in 2002-03. Leslie, who showed greater statistical improvement than any other SEC sophomore, exploded for a career-high 34 points in the Bulldogs' finale against Vanderbilt at the SEC Tournament. Sophomore guard Dustin Ware surpassed 100 assists and in doing so, he joined just two other Georgia alumni -- Rashad Wright and Litterial Green -- to reach 100 in each of his first two seasons.

KENTUCKY WILDCATS

The Wildcats rolled in the 2010 NCAA Tournament advancing to the Regional Finals for the 31st time in program history. Kentucky is the all-time NCAA leader in wins with 2,023. John Calipari is the first coach in NCAA history to have five straight 30-win seasons. Calipari was named SEC Coach of the Year by the Associated Press. Calipari received the Adolph Rupp Cup for National Coach of the Year, while John Wall received the Adolph Rupp Trophy for National Player of the Year. John Wall was named the SEC Player of the Year as voted by the league coaches. He is Kentucky's first SEC POY since Keith Bogans in 2003 and 13th overall. DeMarcus Cousins was named SEC Freshman of the Year by league coaches. DeMarcus Cousins (1st Team Coaches & AP), Patrick Patterson (1st Team Coaches; 2nd Team AP) and John Wall (1st Team Coaches & AP) were all named All-SEC. The USBWA selected Wall 1st Team All-America, while Cousins got 2nd Team honors.

Jarvis Varnado tied his SEC single-season mark he set last year with 170 blocks and finished his career with an NCAA record 564 blocks. The loss to North Carolina dropped the Bulldogs to 7-7 all-time in NIT play. Overall, MSU is 18-17 in the postseason, including its 11-10 ledger in the NCAA Tournament. With Rick Stansbury at the helm, the Bulldogs are 10-10 in the postseason. Jarvis Varnado finished his MSU career second in rebounds (1,096), 13th in scoring (1,403) and first with 119 starts. Barry Stewart finished his career seventh in scoring (1,602), first in minutes (4,431), first in made 3-pointers and attempts (280 of 779), sixth in free throws made (344), fourth with 162 steals and tied for first with Jarvis Varnado in games played at 141. Ravern Johnson's 87 made 3-pointers were the third highest in a single season and is fourth all-time with 177. Dee Bost now ranks 8th with 344 career assists, while his 188 this year were the sixth most in a single season. MSU finished the year with records in 3-pointers made (329) and attempted (918).

South Carolina concluded its season with a 68-63 loss to Alabama in the opening round of the SEC Tournament last week. Senior guard Devan Downey – one of the most prolific scorers in SEC history – concluded his season with 699 points, including 419 in SEC action. Downey's point total was the third-highest in a single-season in Carolina history, while his 85 steals were the fifth-highest in a single campaign. Downey concludes his career in the Garnet and Black No. 4 on the all-time scoring list (1,901), first in field goals attempted (1,634), first in steals (277) and steals per game (3.0). Junior forward Sam Muldrow collected 97 blocks this season – third-most in a single-season in South Carolina history – while he also paced the team in rebounds with 6.2 per game. Senior guard Brandis Raley-Ross concludes his Gamecock career just 147 points shy of 1,000 with 853. Freshman forward Lakeem Jackson – who pulled down an impressive 14 rebounds, including 10 on the offensive glass vs. Alabama last Thursday – contributed 7.2 points, 5.0 rebounds, 1.9 assists and 1.5 steals per game.

Bruce Pearl has now led his team to the NCAA Tournament 16 times in 18 years as a head coach. Wayne Chism earned first-team All-SEC honors this season after being named to the SEC All-Freshman Team in 2007 and receiving second-team All-SEC acclaim last year. Tennessee's 57 SEC wins since the 2005-06 season are the most in the conference over that period.
